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hope a half a dozen of you will ask our most ambitious proponents of business incentives, when does it end? It didn't end with the last cycle. Now we're going to give \$20 million to \$30 million more out of our budget. We're not going to increase taxes so it has to come from someplace else. Is this the last round? No. I say no because the system has not stopped. Other states will continue to raise their business incentives. We'll be in another cycle of decline, forced to give out more business incentives until the courts or until the federal Congress steps in and says, no, we're not using state business incentives in this manner anymore. We're going back to the rational basis of free enterprise and Adam Smith and letting businesses locate where they should locate on the basis of the true economic factors...

PRESIDENT SHEEHY: Time.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...related to the cost of production. Thank you.

PRESIDENT SHEEHY: Senator Byars, you're recognized on AM1028.

SENATOR BYARS: Thank you, Lieutenant Governor. Senator Beutler, members of the Legislature, I think you're right on in the dialogue, in continuing from the dialogue that we had yesterday. How do we truly do a study to reform Medicaid when it's not only Medicaid that is the problem? We cannot do this in a vacuum. All of the circumstances, all of the issues that you brought forward, Senator Beutler, are absolutely right on. We have to look at economic cycles. We have to look at the responsibility of business and what can they afford. What can we do to partner with them to make insurance available? Let's talk about who is uninsured in the state of Nebraska and why. And understand many of those people that are uninsured are still not eligible for Medicaid, but many of those individuals become the indigent and they show up at the emergency room of your local hospital, your local hospital, and your local hospital has the obligation, indeed the law tells them they will provide services to those individuals at no cost.
