again some more people from the user group, two superintendents We've reduced the representation from ESUs, or principals. distance education consortia, Department of Education and PSC from 2 members to 1 member each. We've...there remains a member from the Nebraska Educational Telecommunications Commission. It does clarify the expertise we would like represented by the people in the postsecondary education part of the task force. And it discusses as well that the Department of Education representative would be appointed by the Executive Board of the Legislative Council rather than the Governor. There are some other changes which, in part, repeat the changes I mentioned to you earlier in the committee amendment. This is the task force that we would like to move forward with, 15 members. it's a reasonable balance between having a group that is of size that is manageable but yet represents enough of the sectors involved and enough of the expertise involved so that we can come up with a recommendation that you would find useful. With that I'll stop. I would recommend... I will urge you to support amendment to the committee amendment, and then the amended committee amendment. Thank you.
