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would have had an earlier warning of this, and could have reacted to that, or at least had that in their scenarios as they worked through the last two months, without getting caught here at this time. It's really more of a point of future reference, because we did this with NETV. We spent millions of dollars, millions and millions and millions of dollars on NETV. And a lot of that coordination and so forth, most of it all came through the Appropriations Committee in the past. The task force, the Nebraska ETV Commission, was even created by the Appropriations Committee to do that. And so I would suggest that some of what we're hanging up here today is money. Most of you have talked about engineering, software, and other things, which has been intensely discussed over the years, in my mind, on Appropriations. And so now we're a little bit bogged down because we don't have all the information to coordinate it. And it all comes back to one thing--millions of dollars. And that's the issue. So, just as a comment, I guess, maybe a point of education for us all as we move forward in the next few years. These...it is important to have them properly referenced. And that is no dig at the Education Committee at all. It's just that we have difficulty in here coordinating all our committees so that we all know what we're doing. And there's no process other than the floor to do this. But we've spent a couple hours on something that probably could have had a lot of that discussion in the Appropriations Committee, on the money side, rather than Education. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Stuthman.
