SENATOR BROWN: The \$8 million, though, doesn't have anything...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BROWN: ...to do with the task force recommendations, does it? It's for after the task force.

SENATOR RAIKES: Yes. It's in some way anticipating a task force recommendation regarding updating technology.

SENATOR BROWN: Well, one of the things that Senator Redfield brought up--and it may have just been in a conversation between the two of us--is that we have a great deal of willingness to provide classes, but maybe not as much of a market for that, in terms of groups that wanted to receive classes. And do you have examples, good examples, not of where there's a provision of services--I mean, that's got to be part of the equation--but where there's a...the receiving of services has really improved education?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator.

SENATOR RAIKES: Saved by the bell.
