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certainly.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes. Thank you. And I want to say something about that in a few minutes. But I want to find out your intentions here, Senator Chambers. I think Senator Brown has just alluded...or stated the fact that this is bracketed until a recess day. And normally, in the normal course of events, doesn't this bill get bracketed, in a sense that it can't be taken up until after the appropriations bill, anyway?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, what I had stated the last time I spoke, I may not even take this to a vote, anyway.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Oh, you did?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: It's for the purpose of the discussion.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: It's just for discussion. So I don't need to question you any further about that. I am...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Not on the date.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...I am opposed to the bracket motion. Could be because I think it will be considered, along with everything else, at some point in time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But could I make a confession?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'm a day behind. I was thinking the 8th would be Thursday. So I'm...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: (Laugh) Oh, I'm so pleased to hear you say...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...acknowledging that, too.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...that occasionally there's a slip there. I do want to thank you for your comments about your women colleagues. And I think that if people aren't aware that they need to be that in a matter of a few months or so we're going to
