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like me to say things like that which sound as if I'm saying do this or else? You all do it all the time.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But you're just not as explicit and forthright as I am. That's why people don't know exactly what manner of senator you are, because you hedge. You won't say yea or nay. And as I was getting ready to say the other day when I was talking to one of my colleagues, the hottest place in that bad place is reserved for those who are lukewarm, the ones that the "Bibble" said, I will spew you out of my mouth because you are neither hot nor cold. You want to be right in the middle. And it won't work, because if you try to be in the middle, you're going to be on the griddle, the hottest part. Mr. President, I will ask for a call of the house, if you please.
