SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Baker, you're recognized to open on your amendment to LB 82.

SENATOR BAKER: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I would ask that we withdraw that amendment, please.

SENATOR CUDABACK: It is withdrawn. Mr. Clerk, next motion, when you get time.

CLERK: Senator Beutler would move to amend with AM0976.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler, you're recognized to open on your amendment.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Clerk, Senator Cudaback, I'd withdraw that amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The amendment is withdrawn. Mr. Clerk, when you get time, next amendment.

CLERK: Senators Beutler and Baker would move to amend with AM1139. (Legislative Journal pages 1145-1147.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler, are you first? Senator Beutler, you're recognized to open.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Cudaback, members of the Legislature, Senator Baker and I have worked together on this. And there are three little separate things that have been put together for purposes of looking at it as one amendment. Senator Baker will talk about the main thrust of the amendment. But it has to do with persons towing a motor vehicle, and what the notification requirements are with respect to the owner and with respect to lien holders. It deals with that business generally. One of the things that is required is a notice. That notice has several provisions, several items that are required to be given to the owner and lien holders. And among those is a statement that the motor vehicle is subject to a lien and to disposition within a certain number of days. One of my two parts of this little amendment is to give notice specifically to the owner and whoever else gets notice that the sale can take place within
