that age. So I would like to ask you what your preference is on that matter. Mine would be dealing with Section 12, as presently included in the amendment before us now that you're offering. And Section 12 begins in line 26 on page 5, and continues through page 6.

SENATOR STUHR: I really...I guess we need to visit a little bit. Because right now, they need...the bill would remain the same, that performing body art on any person under 18 years of age, they would need to have a prior written consent of the parent or a court-appointed guardian, and then they also must retain a copy of that. I didn't understand what you were planning to do.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. So then let me be clear.

SENATOR STUHR: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If you withdraw the portion...

SENATOR STUHR: Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...of your amendment that you're talking about,...

SENATOR STUHR: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...a person would be able, with parental consent,...

SENATOR STUHR: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...to get the body...

SENATOR STUHR: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...art.

SENATOR STUHR: Yes, they would be. Yes. That is the way the law is presently written. And that is on page 5, number (17).
