SENATOR STUHR: ...to have that removed.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Suppose...

SENATOR STUHR: So the process is probably more costly and...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Suppose I were going to have tattooed, on the pillow portion of my smallest finger, a star the size of a grain of rice. I couldn't have that done if I were under 18, could I, even with parental consent?

SENATOR STUHR: Yes, if we do not pass the amendment. I mean, if we keep the law just as it is.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, then...

SENATOR STUHR: With parental consent.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...if you're going to withdraw Section...I meant part 12 of your...

SENATOR STUHR: Eleven and 12.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...amendment, then I will not have any problem.

SENATOR STUHR: All right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR STUHR: Thank you.
