PRESIDENT SHEEHY: Senator Beutler, you're recognized to close.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members of the Legislature, let me simply remind you, first of all, what the amendment would do. It would not take out of the bill any of the education provisions. All of the argument today on the floor has been in favor of the education provisions. I would certainly vote for this bill all the way through the process with its education provisions. Those provisions can be nothing What it does take out of the bill is the one but helpful. section that would take away the requirement to wear helmets. Everything, almost everything, the large predominance of what is out there and what you have heard today, in terms of attempts to make meaningful information, to make meaningful information related to this issue, reaffirms what everybody's common sense would tell them, that some kind of helmet between the tissue of the head and the pavement is probably going to make some kind of difference.
