I support Senator Synowiecki's amendment; I support Senator Erdman's bill, but this was just an opportunity for me to get up and say something about, we need to keep, as senators, our eyes on numbers and get exact and direct numbers from all of these bureaucracies, so we know what we're working with. SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Pedersen. Further discussion? Senator Chambers. Is Sen...he is. You are recognized, Senator.

Thank you, Mr. President, members of the SENATOR CHAMBERS: Legislature. I have an amendment very similar to Senator Synowiecki's, and I have not had time to take the bits in mine which differ from his, so I'll put my amendment on the desk and I hope that it would be adopted. Then, before the bill is actually taken up on Final Reading, we will have the opportunity to meld the two amendments together. And I will tell you where mine differs. The first part of it is very similar. You're talking about these companies that have signed the agreement to receive the tax incentives. We are the same when it comes to saying, give the name and address of the business. I would also want the number of employees of the business. Then a specific question, instead of presuming this, whether the business offers health benefits to its employees, and if so, the nature and scope of the health benefits. That would mean whether or not there is total coverage, whether there is partial, percentage of the premiums the employee may be required to pay, or if...the company might say, we'll pay for yours, but none of the family members. Then the number of employees and the number of spouses or dependents of employees who are covered under this health plan, and the nature and scope. Then this report will be submitted annually on February 1 to the Health and Human Services Committee of the Legislature, and the Revenue Committee of the Legislature. This would make sure that although the bill that we're talking about is limited in its reach,
