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Association. And working hand in hand with farmers, these organizations have done more for habitat for our wildlife in this state and more for fish restoration than any of us could ever do here in this body by legislation. I have a lot of respect for these people and they are the ones that are bringing this...

SPEAKER BRASHEAR: One minute.

SENATOR SCHROCK: ...issue forward and I am just a servant. Senator Chambers, I want to tell you my dilemma. The Omaha World-Herald writes an editorial opposed to what I'm trying to do. But I talked to the editor of the Holdrege Daily Citizen this weekend, and he's all in favor of what we're supposed to do. So what does the body do? Do we follow the Omaha World-Herald or do we follow the Holdrege Daily Citizen? That's the dilemma I have this morning. So I thought you might find that rather interesting. Thank you.

SPEAKER BRASHEAR: Thank you, Senator Schrock. Yours is the next light. Would you care to continue? Senator Schrock waives the opportunity to speak. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I do not recommend that we follow either newspaper. I'm saying that the editorial in the World-Herald this...that appeared Saturday and which I handed out this morning is correct in its assessment and evaluation of this issue. There is no need that these words that Senator Schrock is trying to get into the constitution should be placed there. And I would like to ask him a question.
