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SENATOR REDFIELD: Senator, you probably might want to address that question to Senator Jensen, because he has been far more involved in the coordination of those boards and how they function.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Thank you. I'll ask Senator Jensen and then I might come back. Senator Jensen, would you answer a question or two?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Jensen, would you yield?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Jensen, is there a separate board that manages the Behavioral Health Services Fund?

SENATOR JENSEN: No, there is not. That's the division of Health and Human Services. There's not a separate board.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So why does not the Health and Human Services System manage that \$2 million which...first of all, if these funds are located in the Department of Economic Development, with this bill they will continue to be located there. HHSS, under this amendment, would administer the funds that will go for the housing pursuant to this Affordable Housing Trust Fund aspect...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...that goes to the behavioral...well, let me say they would...

SENATOR JENSEN: That is correct. They will administer those.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Why can't they do that now?

SENATOR JENSEN: Well, when the bill, LB 1083, was passed, we had that portion going to DED, Department of Economic Development. And we thought that they're in housing that they would do that. But this is not really development of new
