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confirmation?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Byars, would you yield?

SENATOR BYARS: Yes, I certainly will.

SENATOR SMITH: Very quickly, Senator Byars, you suggested that I wanted to do away with helmets. Did you really mean that?

SENATOR BYARS: Not in its entirety. I think the information that I have, 976 riders would still be required to wear helmets and 58,810 would not.

SENATOR SMITH: Be required to, but...

SENATOR BYARS: Correct.

SENATOR SMITH: ...but we can...could we expect more than that to wear helmets, even if they're not forced to?

SENATOR BYARS: I would certainly hope so.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Smith. Further discussion on the bracket motion offered by Senator Jensen, Senator Engel. Senator Engel, on the bracket motion, please. Senator Engel, did...
