SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Smith. You've heard the opening on AM1312 to the Jensen amendment. Open for discussion, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I need to ask Senator Smith a question or two about his crawdad amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Smith, would you yield to a question?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Smith, do you know what a crawdad is?

SENATOR SMITH: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You do. Okay. What exactly does your amendment do, this version? Does this one have the eye protection with it?

SENATOR SMITH: It still does, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And there will be the motorcycle safety training that would still be a part of it?

SENATOR SMITH: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And what else is in it?

SENATOR SMITH: It would be the law of Nebraska that a helmet would be required but a motorcyclist must be pulled over for another infraction, a different infraction than simply not wearing a helmet.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: For example, crossing the center line.

SENATOR SMITH: Absolutely.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Turning without signaling.

SENATOR SMITH: That's correct.
