about, which are legal, over-the-counter drugs. They're not like beer, where there is an age limit and so forth, but I won't try to go into that in these two or three seconds. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Bourne, followed by Senator Beutler on the Beutler amendment.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you, Mr. President, members. I'll be brief. I appreciate Senator Beutler's efforts in this amendment. He has indicated that he is going to pull the amendment and we're going to look at this on Select File. I do believe that it kind of controls the other end. But as Senator Chambers mentioned, this is a legal product and my legal counsel was saying to me that he has one child with an allergy of one kind and his wife has one of another, and he says we probably have more of this product in our closet than the law would allow, as proposed in this amendment. So I think there's some merit to this idea. I think, you know, it is hard after a certain point, if you have five or six or eight or ten boxes of pseudoephedrine-based product in your possession, all of a sudden it does seem like it's not necessarily for personal use and that you're going to be doing something else with it. So I think there's some merit to the idea, but I do think...and I appreciate Senator Beutler's willingness to float the idea and then withdraw the amendment, because I think we have to get these numbers right, so as to listen to what Senator Chambers says, in a way, in that this is a legal product and we have to involve ourselves in people's ability to purchase this product in the minimal way possible and yet still control the one essential ingredient of methamphetamine, and that's pseudoephedrine. Thank you.
