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federal law--I've just been handed this--under federal law, it has to be...you have to...it has to be filled by a pharmacist, and you do have to sign...or, it has to be under some sort of a logbook.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Thank you,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...Senator. That helps with some of the basic information. Thank...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Friend.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...you, Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR CUDABACK: This will be your third time, Senator.

SENATOR FRIEND: I'd like to call the question on this amendment, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Friend, that won't be necessary, because there are no further lights on. Thank you, anyway. Senator Beutler,...

SENATOR FRIEND: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: ...you're recognized to close.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Cudaback, members of the Legislature, I think this has been a very good discussion, at least from my perspective. I've learned a lot. As I indicated to you earlier, I made a commitment to Senator Bourne that this amendment would be for discussion purposes only. Both of us were comfortable with that approach, because as we've learned in the discussion, there are several different approaches here that might be taken to the question of possession of these particular drugs, and how you get them. So with that, I think we should move on with the conversation. And I would withdraw the amendment, and ask the Clerk to refile it on Select File.
