troopers, and other white cops. So if he looks like a Mexican, he's stopped. Why is he stopped? A pretextual reason. The car went over the center line. This person happens to have meth, so they stumble on a bust. Then it's problematic whether a court is going to allow the...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...evidence in, because if the stop was found to be pretextual, it violates the constitutional right against unreasonable stops, searches, and seizures. There was no probable cause to stop the person in the first place. I'm very distrustful of the police. I don't believe that any additional resources are going to be dedicated to interdicting the meth that comes into this state. This bill, if enacted into law, is not going to do anything of consequence. If it's signed by the Governor, the day after it takes effect, you're not going to notice any change. The week after, the month after, the year after, nothing. But the Legislature and the Governor and the Attorney General will feel good, because a bill was put into law. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. And you may continue.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, Senator Bourne and his staff, the staff of the Judiciary Committee, have worked hard on this subject. Senator Aguilar has given time to it. So have others. I have no question that people throughout the society with any awareness, even if it's only anecdotal, about the scourge of methamphetamine, I have no doubt that they are very sincere. I have no doubt that any and everybody aware of this problem, who would like to see it go away, would do anything they could to see that accomplished. But here's where the disconnect comes in. They cannot admit that they can't solve it, they can't do anything, taking the course that this Legislature is taking, to do anything about it. Let the federal government ban ephedrine and pseudoephedrine. Let the federal government declare it one of those substances so dangerous it cannot be used or possessed legally by anybody in this country. Why can't it do that? Why
