SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BOURNE: ...is a sufficient means of tempering people who want to go in and buy this in large quantities. So I think it's the least intrusive means to accomplish the goal we're trying to get at. We're not trying to put people in jail. stop or limit trying to the accessibility of pseudoephedrine. And again, I can't make that clear enough. And you know, Senator Beutler, you have a good point. But that...you know, it's...I don't think you can stop people from using methamphetamine if they truly want to do it, or if they're They'll find it. They'll go somewhere, you know, wherever state has weaker laws than us. They'll find it.
