SPEAKER BRASHEAR: Yes, that's contemplated. We...beginning at page 4 of the amendment, in Section 4, we specifically set forth certain issues which the task force is required to include within the study: Implications upon competition; need and necessity for provision of wholesale broadband services, Internet services, et cetera; fair and equitable requirements for the regulation and taxation, et cetera. I don't want to take too much of your time. But we lay out the specific issues, the minimal,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SPEAKER BRASHEAR: ...number of specific issues which they are required to consider and report upon.

SENATOR BROWN: Are the representatives on the task force...do you think that there is someone with the tax understanding that is going to be able to answer some of those questions? Because there was a lot of difference in what Senator Schrock said about the tax implications and what you said.

SPEAKER BRASHEAR: There are six members to be appointed between the Executive Board of our Legislature and the Governor. I would hope, from among those six, we would see the right kinds of composition in terms of background and experience.

SENATOR BROWN: Okay. Thank you very much. I support the Brashear amendment. I have spent a lot of time listening to this subject and I think that...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator Brown.

SENATOR BROWN: ...this is the best approach. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Brown. (Visitors introduced.) On with discussion, Senator Beutler, followed by Senator Engel and eight others.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Cudaback, members of the Legislature, I think this is a very important bill and Senator Brashear has brought in front of us a very important discussion. And
