SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...from either retail or wholesale services of these four types, these four categories of services? Because if we pass this bill, that's what we're going to do, on a permanent basis. This is not a temporary part of the bill; this is a permanent part of the bill. And then it also says a public power supplier shall not provide on a retail basis any of these types of services. So the two permanent parts of the bill that we're talking about is that public entities, other than public power districts, can't provide on retail or wholesale basis, any of these services that are identified, and with respect to a public power company, we're taking them permanently out of the retail side of it. So I hope everybody will give serious thought to whether you want to do that, and explore with Senator Brashear and the floor the dimensions and the implications of those kinds of permanent changes.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Brashear, on your amendment. Senator Brashear waives his opportunity to speak.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Next speaker, Senator Kopplin, followed by Senator Chambers.

SENATOR KOPPLIN: Thank you, Senator Cudaback and members of the Legislature. This procedure has been a real lesson for me. I listened to both sides of the issue in committee, and I've got to admit, I got hung up in it, listened to the powers that be and made some decisions without knowing what the real effect on people would be. And I'm referring to Section 2, as Senator Beutler did. Under Section 2, again, any political subdivision of the state shall not provide Internet services and so on.
