SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. You've heard the opening on AM1429 offered by Senator Chambers to the committee amendments to LB 425. Open for discussion, Senator Don Pederson.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this is a very small amount and I know it's very well-intended by Senator Chambers. I think I should tell you why it is fixed at \$70,000. Number one, that's what was used the last time the transition was needed. Secondly, this is the amount of money that was requested by the Governor's office for a transition fund for the change of office in two more years. And then thirdly, as far as the money is concerned, it's our experience, think, that we tend to use what money is available. And if they think that they can do it at the \$70,000 mark, then I think that's the target and they try and do it within that amount. think if you made it \$100,000 be try and work within that figure; \$200,000 the same thing. So I think if they feel that they can do that at that price, that's fine; but there's another alternative. In the event that the cost of transition exceeded that amount of money, there is always the opportunity to come in for a deficit request. So with that and for the reasons that stated, I would request that you follow what the Appropriations Committee has done, recognizing that Senator Chambers is very well motivated in seeking this difference. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Pederson. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, and respectfully to Senator Don Pederson, I would agree that if you made a large amount of money available some might find a way to spend it. But I went the other direction. If we struck all of the money, a way would be found to get the money, but the way that the money is going to be procured is not what I think ought to happen. We should not let an incumbent Governor limit what may be available for a new Governor, should that contingency
