discussion on the Beutler amendment? Senator Beutler, there are no further lights on. Senator Beutler waives closing. The question before the body is, shall FA261 be adopted? All in favor vote aye; those opposed vote nay. The question before the body is the Beutler amendment, FA261, which is an amendment to the committee amendments, known as AM0249 to LB 90. Have you all voted who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of Senator Beutler's amendment to the amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The amendment has been adopted. Mr. Clerk, anything further to the committee amendments?

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Chambers would move to amend with FA263. (Legislative Journal page 1453.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, you're recognized to open on your amendment to the committee amendments, FA263.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this is not the amendment I talked about earlier, with reference to the increase in funds. This goes to what Senator Cunningham and I had talked about, so that the city and the county which will obtain a grant will have to give a dollar-for-dollar match in money. So what this amendment does, on page 2, in line 22, is to strike the language that deals with the in-kind contributions. So that, in order for the record to be clear, on page 2, in line 22, the actual words to be stricken would be, quote, or in-kind contributions. I'm asking that you adopt this amendment. And then you will be rid of me on LB 90. But I'll be coming back on LB 90A. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. You heard the opening on the Chambers amendment, FA263. Senator Cunningham.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Thank you, Senator Cudaback and members. I do rise in support of Senator Chambers' amendment, and I would hope you would give it a green vote. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Cunningham. Further
