Revenue Committee who did not support the bill, and I will tell you that the eminent domain issue, for me, was overwhelming. And since it was not stricken from the bill, I honestly could not support any element of it. I will tell you there was one part of it, though, that I thought was worthwhile because it talked about really local governments having control, and that was the ability for a local government, county in this instance, to actually levy a sales tax within the district that was being formed if, in fact, there was still a municipality outside of that district that had a sales tax. Currently, we don't allow that authority, and I thought that that was an element of local control and I actually liked it. We were talking about a local Nebraska business and, of course, we wanted to find a way to support that. But at the same time, we have always been very, very careful in not expanding our definition for tax credits to the retail sector, mainly because retailers go where the people are. And if they want the marketplace, they will come. So the question is whether it's really a tourism issue. Well, there are those on the floor who would argue that it is. I would tell you it probably isn't. But I know that in Minneapolis there is a mall that has been built and it has an amusement park in the center and there are people who actually get on an airplane and they fly there just to shop. Now we haven't offered that here. Perhaps that would be able to qualify under the terms of the bill. But because I was very concerned about some of the other elements, the richness of the package, and certainly the eminent domain issue, I will confess to you that I did not study in great depth in the Revenue Committee some of the other elements with the bonding, and so I do have some questions for Senator Landis if I could address those.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Landis, would you yield to a question of Senator Redfield?

SENATOR LANDIS: I'll do my best.

SENATOR REDFIELD: Senator Landis, I had someone ask me in the lobby about the bonding issue, and I had to be honest, I really didn't know whether I could support bonding.
