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third largest industry, and I continue to support tourism. But in this particular instance, I think when we're...this, we're treading new ground here when we're going into the retail establishments to attract tourists. You know, in our area, like in Sidney, Nebraska, that is very...attracts a lot of people out there in Sidney. But you know, between Kearney and the Arch and the Wyoming border, what else is there out there? So tourists do stop and it is very attractive. I've been there many times. Some of the...the store they have in Texas, it's in a remote area and it is an attraction. And they have...up in Minnesota, they have one. It's kind of in a remote area, not totally remote, but remote area, so it is an attraction, but it's not right in Minneapolis. And as far as I'm concerned, the competition that this would give to our other retail outlets who sell similar products in the Omaha area, I just...I think it's just a fairness thing. I don't think it's something that we really should get into. And I'm all for tourism. Anything we can do to promote tourism, that's fine, but I don't think this is a way we should do it, because I think Senator Redfield just mentioned, where are we going to draw these people in from? You know, there's people in Nebraska who are going to stop there, but people from Kansas City aren't going to drop in. I don't think they'll drive over from Des Moines. They're certainly not going to come down from Minneapolis where the population centers are. They're not going to...if they do come in from Denver and so forth, they're going to stop at the one in Sidney. So there are Cabela's outlets. And I have nothing against Cabela's, or I guess Senator Chambers has renamed them "Caballa's," whatever "Caballa's" means. But I'm sure he has a definition of that particular word. But I, in this particular instance...and I support our economic package, everything we're doing other than this, and I support tourism, but I just simply cannot support this particular segment of the bill. Thank you.
