SENATOR CHAMBERS: And who would that one be?

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: You.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of LR 9.

SENATOR CUDABACK: LR 9 has been adopted. Mr. Clerk, LR 15, please.
