SENATOR CUDABACK PRESIDING

SENATOR CUDABACK: Has been a request for a call of the house. All in favor of the house going under call vote aye; those opposed vote nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 38 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, to place the house under call.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The motion was successful. The house is under call. All unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Unexcused senators...there aren't any unexcused. All senators report to the Chamber. The house is under call. Senator Burling, would you check in, please? Senator Chambers, the...Senator Chambers is present. All members are present. Been a request for a roll call vote in reverse order. Mr. Clerk, please read the question before the body.

CLERK: Mr. President, the motion is that LB 126 become law notwithstanding the objections of the Governor.
