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It's in the tax asking. You can track that every year. So, it's not immediately up-to-date. I think the most recent information we have available is two years old, if I'm not mistaken, but that is...if you're asking for the data and how you can get it, that would be the information and that is collected through the department.

SENATOR SMITH: So we'll have to go through district by district on the tax asking for each district?

SENATOR RAIKES: The information is provided district by district. There may be in some systems where, if what you're asking, if it's building by building, I'm not sure that's reported to the state, but...but the...and, in fact, I'm almost sure it's not reported to the state in budget information. Now, in the annual financial report there may be some final information, final financial data that's available on a building basis. I'm not quite...

SENATOR SMITH: No, I'm not looking for buildings. I just want to make sure that the...what's kind of been promised here is going to take place, and so I want to be able to try to keep tabs on that, as...

SENATOR RAIKES: Okay.

SENATOR SMITH: ...some who's looking out for tax dollars.

SENATOR RAIKES: Okay.

SENATOR SMITH: So then you're telling me I have to go to the Department of Education and go district by district and try to add up the savings in the tax asking?

SENATOR RAIKES: I'm telling you that would be the best way to get the information that I think I understand that you would like.

SENATOR SMITH: Okay. Thank you. Thank you, Mr. President.
