SENATOR CUDABACK: Chairperson Schimek, you're recognized to open.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President and members. Major Tuma appeared before the committee this past week. He is a new appointment, of course, to this, as the superintendent of the State Patrol. He actually will take office tomorrow on June 4 and serves, of course, at the pleasure of the Governor. The committee did ask a lot of questions of Mr. Tuma and we were extremely impressed with his resume, and I don't know how much of it to go through, but he's not only been with law enforcement for 25 years, but he's served on groups like the Governor's leadership group on terrorism; the Governor's committee on domestic preparedness; Police Standards Advisory Council; Governor's council Nebraska Crime Commission; year 2000...remember that, (laugh) Y2K; State Emergency Response Commission; Governor's nuclear transportation working group; the Governor's designee for transportation and security, which involved nuclear shipping; and a lot of other committees: the state wireless communications project; Nebraska 511 deployment project; the joint operations center project; collocation of the Nebraska State Patrol Training Academy and the Nebraska Law Enforcement Training Center. He has a bachelor of science degree in criminal justice, attended and graduated from the FBI National Academy, went to a law enforcement executive development seminar, and has postgraduate hours at the University of Virginia in Arlington. With that, Mr. President, the committee confirmed this on a 6-2 vote. Two people were absent that day, but we felt that he was highly qualified and recommend him to you for confirmation.
