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SENATOR CHAMBERS: So AM1834 has changed the committee amendment. Is that true?

SENATOR BURLING: It changes the makeup of the commission.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And is that all that was done by your amendment that was adopted?

SENATOR BURLING: Changes the makeup of the commission.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Would you tell me now what the makeup is?

SENATOR BURLING: Okay. Now we have on the commission, with the passage of the AM1834 that we just passed, we have eight senators appointed by the Executive Board, we have a representative of the ag sector, (inaudible)...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now let me ask you this. Pardon me, because I need to be informed. In the committee amendment that I have here, it says eight members, at least six of whom will not be term-limited out. Does that remain, that language remain?

SENATOR BURLING: That's still there.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. And there will still be 16 members on the committee, or was that number changed?

SENATOR BURLING: That's it, 16. That's what we just passed.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. And I'm with you now. Now could you proceed?

SENATOR BURLING: The ag sector representative, and the industry and manufacturing representative, the telecommunications representative, and one economist will be appointed by the Governor. The labor sector representative, the low-income sector representative will be appointed by the Executive Committee. And then the other two are the state Department of Economic Development director and the State Tax Commissioner. That's the 16.
