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SENATOR CHAMBERS: I think my time is up. I'm going to have to speak again. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Chambers, you may continue.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Burling, you don't have to stand up because I'm not going to ask you a question just yet. When I was a lad, I used to go to church--greatest waste of time ever in my life. I went to church enough for everybody. Nobody should have to go to church again. But while going to church, being the type of child that I was, I paid close attention to what people said. And, although a very slow reader, I read what was in the "Bibble," and one of the verses that stuck with me was the following, and I want Senator Burling to pay attention, because what he said just shows that this verse is untrue: I must work the works of him that sent me while it is day, for the night cometh when no man can work. Senator Burling has just shown that that verse in the "Bibble" is untrue. Every place there is a night shift shows that verse to be untrue. When I was growing up, I knew people who worked what was called the night shift, and I was aware of people who worked at night, and my experience told me that what is in the "Bibble" is untrue. So I began to wonder why do people do all this quoting from a book which is not true? And if they're going to quote from a book which is not true, why don't they quote from one which is more entertaining? They had comic books in those days. There was a Mickey Mouse. There was a Donald Duck. There was a Goofy. And while I'm on that, I had said that these people should pray to Mickey Mouse, Donald Duck, and Goofy because they at least know who those individuals are. Well, maybe there was more truth than poetry in what I said. Based on the account I gave you this morning of the mouse, maybe Mickey Mouse should be prayed to. But whether or no, I'm coming back to what Senator Burling has given us. I have a reason for proceeding as I am this morning. There is going to be a lot of trash legislation before us. I'm not going to say that Senator Burling's bill should be characterized in that fashion. We haven't gotten to the final version of it yet. But I'm going to take all of the time that I need on every bill that comes before us, and I'm
