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going to get a thorough understanding and I'm going to have us lay on the record what it is we're doing, why we're doing it, and what good result that benefits the public we expect to achieve. Senator Burling, during all of his discussion, when he was speaking specifically to his bill, not responding to my questions, did not, in my opinion, give an argument sufficiently strong to justify enacting this proposal into law. Senator Burling is a very low-key individual who doesn't bother anybody. Most of the time you're not even aware that he's around. So when he...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...decides to bring us a bill, and you all are known to do favors for people, and you have done it on bills that are far more sinister than this one, I'm going to see how many of you are going to be kind to our colleague. I'm going to see how many of you all, in the spirit of collegiality, will vote for his bill. I'm going to see how many of you, in the spirit of collegiality, will vote for my amendment. I think it has as much legitimacy as anything in Senator Burling's bill, even with the amendment that he has proposed with reference to the makeup or the membership of this commission. I don't believe the Governor...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...should appoint anybody. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you. Further discussion on FA325, offered by Senator Chambers to Revenue Committee amendments? There are no lights on. Senator Chambers, I will recognize you to close on FA325.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Colleagues, you haven't seen the last of this amendment. I'm attempting to amend the committee amendment. If you reject my amendment and the committee amendment is adopted, the committee amendment becomes the bill. I would then offer my amendment to the bill, although I don't really have to do that.
