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SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, four more is still close. It's closer to what the committee did than to what you had, isn't it?

SENATOR BURLING: Yeah.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So if close counts, would you support raising the number to 20?

SENATOR BURLING: Not now.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Maybe by noon?

SENATOR BURLING: I don't know.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Maybe by 2:00?

SENATOR BURLING: I'm not sure.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Will you have discussions with anybody between when we recess to go lunch-hunting and when we come back at 1:30? Will you talk to anybody during that period of time about the number on the commission?

SENATOR BURLING: I may have an opportunity to do that, and I may not.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator. You've heard the...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Was that my third time, Mr. President?

SENATOR CUDABACK: You were opening on your...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, okay.

SENATOR CUDABACK: ...FA326 to LB 542. You may continue.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. President, I'm enjoying this session so much. You know why I like the Legislature to come into session? Let me digress for a minute. I work harder during the interim than I do when we're in session. I wouldn't
