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acceptable under the bill, wouldn't it?

SENATOR BURLING: Well, it certainly asks for some recommendations. But then if they don't do that, why, I guess there aren't any.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, if they don't have any, they can't be compelled. You don't want them to make up something, do you?

SENATOR BURLING: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. If they have no recommendations, they can say in their report, we have no recommendations, and it can cover maybe half a sheet of paper, and that would be a report that would comply with what the law requires, wouldn't it?

SENATOR BURLING: Could.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is that what you envision?

SENATOR BURLING: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: There's nothing to assure that won't happen, though, is there?

SENATOR BURLING: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you like this bill?

SENATOR BURLING: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Just because you brought it?

SENATOR BURLING: No. I would like it anyway.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Did somebody ask you to bring it?

SENATOR BURLING: No.
