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SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Baker, would you...?

SENATOR BAKER: Yes, I would respond.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Baker, do you have a copy of the amendment that was adopted? Okay. Would you go to the same language I was discussing with Senator Burling, which would be found in line 27 on page 2, lines 1 and 2 on page 3.

SENATOR BAKER: I'm sorry, Senator Chambers. I have an explanation of the amendments...the committee amendments on the...but I don't have an actual copy of that amendment. I have the summary from the committee, is what I was working off of.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So then...

SENATOR BAKER: I'll have to get that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So what you're telling me is that they tell you that high noon you and Chambers are going to have a face-off, a showdown, a shootout on Main Street, and Chambers comes and he's got his hardware ready, and you say, but wait, I don't have my weapon; I've got an announcement that we're supposed to come here and have this fight. You haven't got your armaments right now, Senator Baker. How long would it take you, do you think, to get a copy of the amendment itself?

SENATOR BAKER: A few minutes at most.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, then I will pass on. I will ask Senator Stuthman, who sits immediately in front of me and slightly to my right.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Stuthman, would you yield to a question?

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Yes, it would be my privilege.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Stuthman. Would you turn to page 2, beginning in line 27, and go to the top of page 3.
