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SENATOR BURLING: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Burling. You've been very reasonable, and that's all I will ask you on this. But I'm going to take some time, now that that has been achieved. When I look in this subsection, I see the word "demographic." Does that relate...I'd like to ask Senator Stuthman a question, because he's on this bill, and he's had time to study it now.
