white people against black people. That's happening in America. And you all wonder why I don't feel about these things what you all might feel? I'm going to raise issues and raise Cain when and were appropriate. But now that I've brought to your attention one of those things that is very wrong going on in this country right now, I'm going to get to the amendment that I'm offering here. The problem with me...the problem for me, is that I read these bills and amendments that come before us, and I take seriously the job that I agreed to do when I became a member of the Legislature, the concern I have for the integrity of the system and the integrity of our statute books and the role they ought to serve in informing the public what is allowed and what is not. And they should be able to read those laws and understand, without a degree from Harvard, Yale, or MIT, what the law is telling them they can and cannot do. This that Senator Burling is offering to us appears to me to be not a tax policy review commission, but a tax reform commission. If you look at page 3, in line 16, when we get down to the operative language of what this commission is supposed to do, whether it's acted on or not, you see that there are to be recommendations for legislation to reform tax policy and, if appropriate, draft proposed language for legislation.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Reform...if they come up with ideas, you don't need a word that strong. You can say, alter, change, modify. But to reform means you overturn, you redo it all. Senator Burling didn't say, reform if indicated, or if appropriate, as he talked about drafting proposed language. He said, containing any recommendations for legislation to reform tax policy. That's a prejudgment. It should not be made. But it has been. So what my amendment would do is wherever the word "review" appears in connection with this commission, that word would be stricken and the word "reform" inserted in its place, so that we have truth and accuracy in labeling.
