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suggested.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Yes. Thank you, Senator Chambers. That is why I am supporting your amendment to pull that part out of it, because I realistically think, you know, if there's going to be eight members of the Legislature serving on it, but six of those--at least six of them--who will not be term-limited out...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator Stuthman.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: ...not be term...thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Stuthman. Further discussion, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'm going to stray a bit from the amendment itself, but you should keep in mind, if you can get a hold on what Senator Stuthman said, of the problems created by the term limit proposal, and any language that makes reference to anybody being term-limited out. Even when a date like this is put in, at the time that January, 2007 comes about, there are people...in fact, everybody in the Legislature is term-limited out, they just don't leave at the same time. But all of us are term-limited out. The point I want to go back to now, because I think this amendment may have a chance of adoption, term limits is erasing far more from this legislative branch of government than the public has any idea of. First of all, the public does not understand what the Legislature does. People who got into the Legislature acknowledge that before coming here, they had no idea of the amount of work, of the amount of knowledge and information which are required to just do a passable job. The hours that are put in were not contemplated before a person got here, because the Legislature has no PR, no public relations arm which informs the public of what our work really consists of. We all hear the joke that everything is at risk when the Legislature is in session. But even those who make that shortsighted joke, which probably will elicit a laugh wherever it is stated, will come to the Legislature when in need of some serious problem being addressed. Like the lawyer jokes, soon as somebody gets in trouble, a lawyer is where they go. This
