And for purposes of determining your intent and clarifying any questions that may arise from either a court challenge or the general public or members of this body, when you say "school" on line 16 of page 11 inside Section 15, do you mean school...does "school" include a private school not recognized as a public school district?

SENATOR COMBS: Yes, it does. It includes all schools, school of any kind, public, private, kindergarten, junior high, high school, trade school, (inaudible).

SENATOR FLOOD: Would that include a preschool?

SENATOR COMBS: Yes, it would.

SENATOR FLOOD: A beauty school?

SENATOR COMBS: Yes.

SENATOR FLOOD: Okay. A community college?

SENATOR COMBS: Um-hum.

SENATOR FLOOD: Creighton University or other public...private

universities?

SENATOR COMBS: That is correct.

SENATOR FLOOD: Okay. So your definition of "school" in line 16, page 11 of LB 454 is a very broad definition, and it is your intent that it be construed very liberally to include all types of educational enterprises, not just public school districts?

SENATOR COMBS: Yes.

SENATOR FLOOD: Okay. And specifically, it would exempt a parochial school, or a private school?

SENATOR COMBS: Exempt them?
