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them are no permit required.

SENATOR McDONALD: So in looking at the...just looking at the map, it's probably maybe 80 percent of shall issue, as you look at the...as you...whole United States. And then we're seeing about maybe three or four of just a few states that are striped...black striped. And what are those saying?

SENATOR COMBS: Those are right-restricted, very limited issue. They will issue them, and it's a very limited restriction. There are eight of those.

SENATOR McDONALD: So how many do not allow concealed carry at any restrictions, will not allow it at all?

SENATOR COMBS: Four.

SENATOR McDONALD: Just four states.

SENATOR COMBS: Right.

SENATOR McDONALD: And that would be Nebraska, Kansas, looks like Illinois, and is that Wisconsin?

SENATOR COMBS: Yes, that is.

SENATOR McDONALD: So those are the only ones that do not.

SENATOR COMBS: That's correct.

SENATOR McDONALD: Looking at this map, it already tells us that the majority of states already do have right to concealed carry, and some of them have more restrictions than others. So we are not the first to adopt this law, nor will we be the last. It just goes to show that it's working in other states. And so why should we deny the right for our people to also have concealed carry? Because we know it's already happening. We know that there are people out there that do carry guns, that have them already. They do not have the training, they are not registered, but yet they're doing it illegally. Will we have more people carrying concealed weapons than do now? I would say
