concealed carry; police chiefs' association, police officers' associations, and the Nebraska...this is from the chairman of the sheriffs' legislative committee. I have listened to a lot of people on all sides of this issue in my community. But I respect and have supported law enforcement, and if Senator Smith thinks, when I say law enforcement I'm using that loosely, you know, I am. But it's because I have letters in my office, and I think you all do, too, from being here nine years, from different people who chaired the committee that came in and presented the letter, who sent letters to the office from the police chiefs, PCAN and the Sheriffs' Association. And also, for a while, I had letters from the Fraternal Order of Police. I don't know that they did last year, but in previous years...this says they...this person had not had contact with them. I don't know what they did. And it also says a survey of the State Troopers Association several years ago indicated opposition. So there may be a few people in law enforcement around the state who support it, but the associations do not. And if anybody wants to see these exhibits from the committee hearing, I'm more than happy to do that. But I am going to cite, because I think this is part of the discussion that Senator Kruse and Senator Chambers sort of passionately said. I don't have as racially diverse a district as they do. district is probably more typical of the rest of the state. But lot of these issues cross over, and this is from the chief of police from Nebraska City. And he says, I feel this bill takes Nebraska backwards in an era where we should be de-escalating situations rather than adding the fuel of concealed carry. Having people walking around...I had a call I made back to somebody early on (laugh) in these years in the Legislature, and you get e-mails from these folks. You had some angry people who want to carry guns. And so I called the guy and he said, well, I called to tell you to vote for concealed carry, and I said, well, you know, I'd like to know what your thinking is. And he well, the police can't be everywhere, and I got some drunks that come to the park once in awhile, and I want to go over and take care of it. Well, I, you know,...you talk about what people get frightened of, that's frightening to me! That is frightening to me. And I think when you're talking about this, we need to listen to the people who deal with this every day. And this is what he says: Enabling concealed carry may
