SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I don't know that it could, and you don't know that, either. So what's the purpose, if it can't be? Does that mean you could have concealed carry, just out in the counties, outside of the city limits? That doesn't make any sense at all. Why don't we send this bill back to committee until we have time to examine those issues? I have asked a number of attorneys today about that very issue, and nobody has a really, really good answer for us. I don't think we should be passing bills that we don't have really good answers for what the bill is really going to do. So I just ask you, most sincerely, to examine that issue and to vote to put this bill back in committee and let the committee ask those hard questions, and let...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ... the committee decide how to solve some of those questions.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Senator Thompson. And this will be your third time, as you know. Senator Thompson, followed by Senators Stuthman and Wehrbein.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Thank you. Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I support the motion to reconsider. I think there are many aspects of this bill that it would be very helpful if the committee would review these things and get this bill out in a condition that we don't have so many gray areas. I'm going to mention another one, and in here, for some reason it's only school-sponsored athletic events that are covered. So in my community, we have many athletic events that happen for children, that happen in city parks, on school places that have ball fields. We have little companies that operate fields. People try to find...there's so much interest in these kinds of activities for children that it's sometimes hard to find space to practice, so it isn't necessarily...I mean, they're everywhere. And we also have a lot of softball in the state of Nebraska and certainly a lot in the metropolitan area, where
