Dr. Joann Schaefer to the deputy...or to the Chief Medical Officer and also to the director of Department of Health and Human Services Regulation and Licensure. Dr. Schaefer received her M.D. from Creighton University. She is a board-certified family practice. She finished her undergraduate degree at California State University-Fullerton, with a degree in biology and a minor in chemistry. Dr. Schaefer is an assistant professor in the Department of Family Practice at Creighton University school in Omaha, Nebraska. She has also been the director of utilization management for Creighton-St. Joe Partnership in Health, and continues to work on utilization and Dr. Schaefer has been contracted by...to be quality issues. the ... or was the Deputy Chief Medical Officer under Dr. Raymond, if you'll recall, and now has been asked to serve the position as Chief Medical Officer. She also has been selected as a young physician leader for Nebraska to the AMA. She's also been honored recently with a nomination for the Woman of Vision Award in Omaha through the YMCA in 2002. Metropolitan Omaha Medical Society also nominated her for Outstanding Young Physician Award from the Nebraska Medical Association. And, to my knowledge, I believe she is the first woman Chief Medical Officer for the state of Nebraska.
