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prayer are allowed. A third-grader could understand this, but it shows the absolute lack of respect that some of these religious people have. They think, because they call themselves righteous and religious, they can take every kind of liberty, do anything they please. Well, when you all bring those kind of wrongdoing people in here and give them the legislative floor, which is not given to ordinary citizens who would respect what it is we ask them to do, expect from me what you're hearing. And if I get up here before the sucker gets through, I'm going to make a demonstration. This Legislature is not a chapel. This place is not a church, and when they bring that nonsensical political zealotry here, they're going to hear from me. What we need is something like "The Gong Show," where you have a long hook and I will be the hook operator, and when one of these jokers gets that far off the line, I'll put that hook around him and drag his "donkey" right off the floor. They need to know. And when these senators invite these people here, tell them and make it clear, and if you don't, I will. The day has been poisoned for me. I've said over and over and over, we don't need these preachers coming in here. Then you all are going to hear something like that and grumble about it, but nobody will say anything except me. I have to uphold the Legislature and its prerogatives, and I intend to do it as long as I am a member here. I have not come on this floor when you all have these various preachers up here to demonstrate and express my opposition to their being here. You all know I have that...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...opposition. And sometimes they come up here and they do stray a bit from the path of righteousness as laid down in the instructions they receive. But I am tolerant. I know the nature of preachers. I know they are arrogant, they are unaccustomed to being called to account. So, rather than embarrass everybody on this floor by coming up here and say, hey, man, sit down, you're outside the rules, I just swallow that and let it go. But this morning it was so far out of line that I would be wrong to allow it, and I'm going to do everything I can to persuade the Legislature to stop these preachers from coming in here and praying. Let 'em pray at home. Let him do like Jesus told him--go in your closet, man,
