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SENATOR MINES: Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator.

SENATOR MINES: Thank you. Yes, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator,...

SENATOR MINES: And you're on the green copy, right?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes. Senator Mines, why did you use the word "senior"?

SENATOR MINES: That is a...I didn't use that term. The term was in Bill Drafters...or the department. Excuse me, the department used the term "seniors."

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The department of what?

SENATOR MINES: Insurance Department. I'm sorry.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator, do you know why they didn't use the word "elderly"?

SENATOR MINES: No, I don't.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Did they give a rationale for using "senior"?

SENATOR MINES: We didn't discuss that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What makes a person a senior under this bill? Do they give an age somewhere?

SENATOR MINES: Sixty-five. Yeah, age 65 and older.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Correct. And I am both of those.

SENATOR MINES: And you are both.
