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schools, Don Stenberg, hired by them to mess over them, is the one who told them, don't file some of these reports until the last minute. Then their failure to get the report filed on time triggered certain negative consequences found in the law. This water situation facing the state was probably abetted by Don Stenberg, his stupidity as a lawyer, and his eternal campaigning and running for office. No matter how the state got where it is, I am going to fight against any effort by Senator Schrock and anybody else to pay these irrigators for their irresponsible actions. They're not entitled to pay for having done wrong. We don't pay our children. These people have damaged the state. I am glad Senator Beutler brought his amendment, and I'm glad the matter is being discussed. I don't know whether there are any bills that are going to come before us where they try to bail out these irrigators, but I'm going to fight it tooth and nail. They have benefited from what they have done. They should not be paid to stop doing something which is damaging. In the cities, I've been opposed to declaring areas blighted which in fact are not, because some big shots got to planning agencies, the mayor, and the city council. I am the one who, down through the years, fought against provisions being put in the statutes that allowed areas which are not in fact blighted to be declared so. It was at a time when this Legislature was giving away all kinds of benefits and concessions to companies. They were trying to give everything away to some Utah company, and they may have made components for computers. I remember...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...fighting against those things, and got nowhere. There are a lot of things that I tried to save the state from, to no avail. And now those interests that thought that I was such a bad fellow are suffering, and some of them are coming to me saying, we know you fight for the little guy. Well, they weren't paying attention when I was fighting for everybody and something could have been done. Senator Beutler is saying the time to cut losses is now. And I'm going to help what he's doing in any way that I can, and fight against contrary proposals. Thank you, Mr. President.
