SENATOR BEUTLER: I want to go back to the chart and explore with your further what it all means, but I think I will not do that with such a short period of time. And let me just say this. Many of you, I think, are going to be uncertain about this amendment, whether it's on the right bill, whether it's the right thing altogether, whether it needs to be fit together with other pieces. The answer is, it's probably not the right bill, it's not the only piece.

SPEAKER BRASHEAR: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: But you've got to send a message to the people who can make this happen, and you've got to send it this year, and you've got to send it early in the session, so that people can get together and reach that critical compromise. Senator Schrock is doing a number of things, but nothing that he is doing comes anywhere close to approaching the scale of the problem as identified by the Department of Water Resources and others. Nowhere close. The one bill...there are two bills that can help a lot. One has already been killed by the Natural Resources Committee, the conservation fee bill that would have put a fee on per acre, per irrigated acre to help solve the problem. It could have raised \$16 million a year, which in a few years' time, combined with some other things,...

SPEAKER BRASHEAR: Time, Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ... could be a part of the solution.
