SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...if you have a portfolio that's only bonds, you could buy junk bonds, every bit as speculative as some of the common stock investments, so you're not protected entirely by words, ever. You're protected by...did you say time, Senator Cudaback?

SENATOR CUDABACK: 30 seconds, I'm sorry.

SENATOR BEUTLER: 30 seconds. You're protected more by the structure that's set up and that is in place. And with respect to this particular community foundation, and with respect to those foundations that may exist in other places when an endowment happens to be made to...directly to the political subdivisions, you will need this law. You don't want to be caught without a mechanism...

SENATOR CUDABACK: It's now time, Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...to deal with the direct donation. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Price, followed by Senator Chambers.

SENATOR PRICE: Thank you, Senator Cudaback and members of the Legislature. I support the bill, I support the amendment, and I support the suspension of the rules. I considered prioritizing this bill. I thought about it for two months, but since this is my last year in the Legislature, then I decided it was time to prioritize my nursing bill, but I really agonized over this, because I feel very passionate about this piece of legislation. Being a health professional, I look at this wonderful handout that Senator Beutler gave us this morning that spells out where the dollars will be...where they're proposed to be spent. This is being proactive instead of reactive in serving people medically. It touches people in their communities where they live, like in the Indian Center, where they come into the Lancaster County Health Department, and just different places where people gather, and they will be served.
