by way of protesting the government's policies? She was a very physically attractive woman. You know what Madame Nhu said? I will provide them with the gasoline. That's what your enemy, that's what your foe, that's what your opponent thinks of you. So I would never harm myself to satisfy my enemy. What my colleagues are going to have to think about, especially those from Lincoln, how much do they want this proposal on the ballot? We cannot enact it. All we can do is put it on the ballot and offer it to the public. And the people in Lincoln hope that the public, by a majority, will vote for it. But we don't have to put it on the ballot. And if it's not narrowed in the way that I think it ought to be, I'm going to fight it. Senator Beutler doesn't owe anything to the city of Omaha. But I'm going to offer these innocuous amendments first, to see if there is any reasonableness at all among those who are supporting this proposal. You all have given them a lot by suspending the rules, amending the committee amendments to include this proposal. Then, at some point, it will have to become the bill. And maybe that's all they should expect to get at this stage in the session. My amendment is designed to eliminate surplusage. And anybody who thinks that the words "governmental or" need to be retained, when we will still have the term "political subdivisions," ought to enlighten me and improve my education. But that's my amendment at this point. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. You heard the opening on FA382. Open for discussion. Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Since it's essentially my language and Senator Beutler's language, that he's approved of, from my perspective, I would accept the amendment. I would yield the rest of my time to Senator Beutler.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Chambers, I appreciate the opportunity to amend other people's bills and for them to have an open mind towards my suggestions, and I would certainly keep an open mind towards the suggestions anybody else is making to my bills. And this is certainly reasonable.
