SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator. You may continue.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. But if there is an endowment fund which can launder money, and then it could be funneled to projects of a political nature, of a discriminatory nature, they wouldn't hesitate to do that. I've lived in Omaha all of my life, and I know Omaha, and I don't trust the administration currently there, and I have not trusted any administration which ever has been in office in Omaha during my lifetime, after the point where I was conscious of such things and aware of what they were doing that were detrimental to the
